It's a little harder to get quality time with older children, so you may need to be more creative. We played board games -- I guess that's ancient history! But as a parent of grown children, I just want to remind parents to enjoy the moment - stay in the present. They grow up in a flash.



## With Help from a Stand By Me Coach, Wilmington man becomes a homeowner

Tom – not his real name – has worked toward home ownership for several years, and he's about to reach that goal.

Almost four years ago, he connected with Marilyn, one of our *Stand By Me* financial coaches. Stand By Me offers free personal, private, one-on-one financial coaching through a partnership between local nonprofits, United Way of Delaware and the State of Delaware.

Tom admits he's had some setbacks. This Wilmington resident has a job; he's worked for 10 years as a service agent for a rental car company. He's enrolled in the Wilmington Housing Authority's first-time home buyers' program. He's currently living in the home he's about to buy.

"I had a low credit score," said Tom. "I had no idea what direction to go. She (Marilyn) helped me out big time."

Tom said he met with Marilyn who explained the steps he needed to follow to improve his credit score and meet the WHA's program criteria. "She taught me how to spend money, to improve my ways of spending. I learned to keep a budget. I had to eliminate the things I didn't need," he said.

Tom acknowledges that making these lifestyle changes required time and patience. "I'm close to closing (on the house). I have to do one more thing. I'm 52 years old. I've had setbacks, but Marilyn has helped me. I keep on pushing. Like they say, 'Good things come to those who wait.'... I'm going to keep up the connection with Stand By Me. It's a good program," he said.


## **Youth Sport Makes Learning About Aerospace Careers Fun**

United Way of Delaware and Walnut Street YMCA in Wilmington are partnering with Delaware Drone Soccer League to introduce Drone Soccer, a competitive sport that can lead to sparking interest in careers in aerospace. Drone Soccer uses hand-sized flying quadcopters in protective plastic exoskeletons that are designed for full-contact gameplay and collisions. Students first learn to construct and repair their drones, and then use them in competitive play.

The first Drone Soccer Scrimmage was Saturday April 1 and was a great success.

The young pilots were placed in two teams; the Blue team and Yellow team, and played three matches of full contact drone soccer. Each team used strategy to fly their drones into the goal, while blocking to prevent the other team from scoring.


